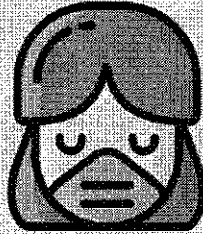

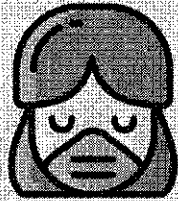

Pixley Families:

On October 1st, California announced a requirement for all school aged children to be vaccinated for COVID-19 once the FDA fully approves the vaccine for their age group.

This means different things for each age group.

- **Middle School: If your child is age 12-14:** Approval for the vaccine has been requested and it is expected to be fully approved by the FDA in November/December. If that happens, **the requirement would begin January 9, 2022, for return to school after winter break.**
- **TK-5: If your child is age 5-11:** The requirement will not be required this year. It is likely to be required next school year.

A very small group of students may qualify for a medical waiver, and your doctor can provide more information about that, if you believe they qualify.

Once required, students without proof of vaccination or a completed medical waiver from the state of California cannot attend in-person schooling. Proof of vaccination can be turned into the school office.

Information about local vaccination events is included in this mailing.

Thank you for continuing to partner as a community with us during this pandemic. We continue to seek the best ways to serve our students and families in the challenges these situations create.
